A few of our local ministries include:

Family Promise

The mission of Family Promise is to help homeless families achieve lasting self-sufficiency. Mount Tabor is one of 22 Protestant, Catholic, and Latter-day Saints congregations in the Salt Lake Valley joining in ecumenical partnership to serve meals and provide safe shelter to homeless families as they transition to stable housing.

Crossroads Urban Center

Crossroads Urban Center helps low-income, disabled and minority Utahns to meet basic survival needs. Every year, Mount Tabor donates nearly 5,000 pounds of food, as well as clothing and financial contributions, to Crossroads.

Utah Food Bank

Tabor members help sort food monthly for the Utah Food Bank.

Our other important social action ministries include the VOA Homeless Youth Resource Center, the VA Fisher House, and ELCA World Hunger.
