

## Welcome to Our Service

**Our mission at Mount Tabor** is to be “an inclusive, compassionate faith community living God’s love in the world.” Mount Tabor is a member of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America and a *Reconciling in Christ* congregation of the ELCA. This means that all are welcome and affirmed, especially our LGBTQ+ siblings, and that we are connected to the world. We all have a place here at God’s round table just as we are!

**If this is your first time here, a special welcome to you!** We are mask optional and mask friendly. Please sign the guest register in the narthex (along with your e-mail and cell) so we can be in touch, put on a name tag, and join us for refreshments after the service.

**The twelve parking slots on the north side of the parking lot** have been leased to students living in Unite Student Living for their use 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. **The slots are numbered 1 to 12. Do not park in these slots as your vehicle may be towed. All other spots** – aside from handicap spaces – **are also rented between 9pm-9am.** Please plan accordingly.

**Holy Communion is open to all.** Children of all ages are invited to receive communion with their parents’ or guardians’ permission. Come when you are ready. Gluten-free bread is available. If you would like a blessing, come to the altar with your arms folded.

**Children are always welcome** in the sanctuary. We are blessed to be part of their faith formation through worship!

**Prayer slips** are available from the ushers. Write your prayers and then leave them in the offering plates to be added to the prayer chain around the altar.

**Please turn off cell phones** in the sanctuary before worship begins.

Let us give thanks for the gift of water and for baptism.





The spirit-filled peace of Christ be with you always!


